

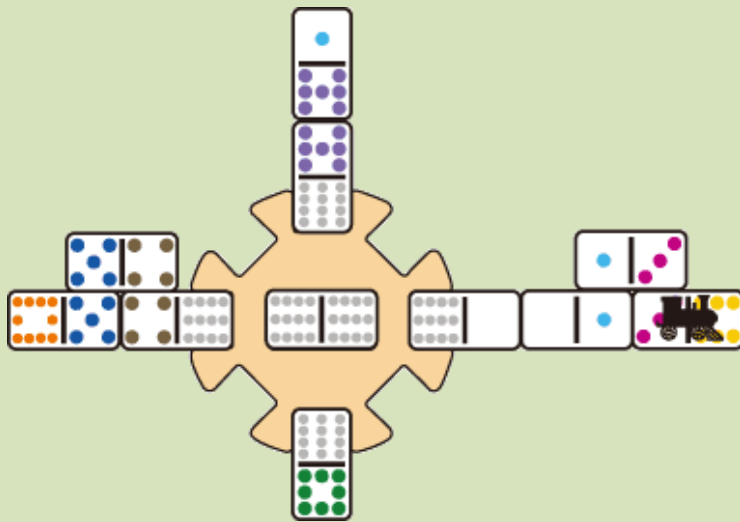

Mexican Train Dominoes Group, Kings Lynn u3a



Mexican Train is a popular domino game played with a double-twelve set. The objective is to be the first player to get rid of all your dominoes by playing them on your personal "train" or the shared "Mexican train" that starts from a central hub. Points are scored by the pips on dominoes left in a player's hand, and a round ends when a player has no dominoes left.

I came up with idea of forming a group as I was playing with friends socially and they all started buying sets. I started with 12 members in January, meeting fortnightly at the Lynncentre. It was originally started as a winter group because I wished to have flexibility for Summer visits with my motorhome. The group now runs itself with up to 16 players every week! Some members still come fortnightly due to other commitments. In the last 5 weeks we have had at least one new player each week, though with holidays and family commitments over Easter the numbers dropped to 12. Currently we have 20 members on our listing.

We have a set purchased by the u3a committee. If I was starting again, I would buy two sets, one with spots and the other with numbers.

A Trip To Duxford: Jolly Days Out Dereham u3a



We had booked a guided visit which centred on the history of the Lancaster bomber, including a rare opportunity to get inside the plane, giving an idea of what it would be like to have been one of the crew on a bombing raid. We also visited the Operation Room and got close up to a Spitfire.

Both of our guides were very well-informed, excellent speakers, delivered in a very

lively and engaging way. They used interesting anecdotes, some of them very funny, but they never lost sight of the terrible impact that the war in the air had both on the crews with the high rate of injuries and deaths and on the poor souls on the ground.

Regional training for Canva on Offer

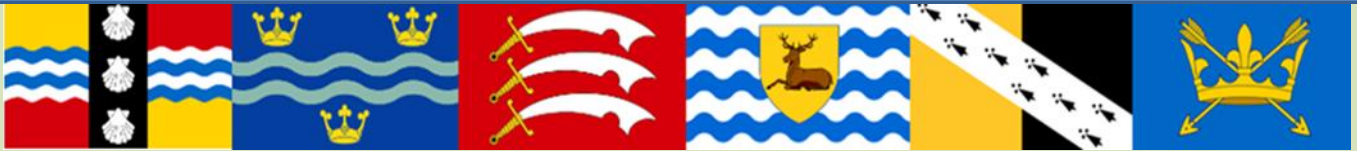

It is a useful introduction, so do take a look.

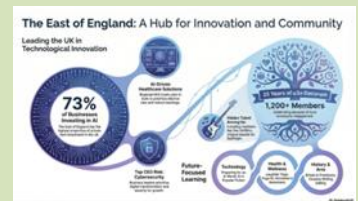
We are planning a beginner's introduction to AI in June and there will be more about that to follow.
